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Government response



United Kingdom government response

Updated Government measures:

• The second national lockdown for England ended 2 December, with the country entering another three-tiered system of measures to prevent the spread.

Other developments:

- The new tier system keeps non-essential retailers, sports and leisure centers and personal care providers open
- The UK approved the Pfizer coronavirus vaccine on 2 December, with patients receiving from 8 December
- The four UK nations have harmonised restrictions over Christmas to allow travel and household mixing


Public sector finances

Key facts

- Tax receipts fell by £5.4 billion in October 2020
- UK supermarket firms are expected to return up to £1.8 billion in unpaid business rates
- A rising number of VAT registered firms is expected to support VAT receipts in 2021 and represents rising confidence

Total HMRC receipts

In the 10 montrhs through October 2020, total tax receipts to HMRC have declined by more than £72 billion, compared to the year before.





Online job adverts


Key facts

- Average adverts for all industries has increased to reach 74% of 2019 levels by the start of December
- Job adverts for Human Health and Social Work has remained high but began to slow
- Hospitality and retail jobs remain below average levels, signalling continued strain




Key facts


- 4.4 million people were waiting for consultant-led elective care in October.
- The percentage of people being seen within 18 weeks plummeted to 46.8% in July 2020.
- The private sector is expected to benefit from growing NHS waiting times.
